Process to Receive a Letter Documenting Legal Blindness in the State of New Hampshire

- 1. An individual contacts our office requesting a letter documenting the fact that have been determined to be legally blind* for property tax exemption and/or other purposes.
- 2. We obtain the caller's name, address, phone number, date of birth, eye doctor's name and inform the caller that he or she would need to provide a recent (1 year or less) eye exam report from their eye doctor (Optometrist or Ophthalmologist). If this office does not already have a signed release of information form on file, we work with the individual and the doctor's office in order to obtain the eye report information and provide a blank eye exam report form to the doctor's office to be returned to us.
- 3. When the eye report is received, it is forwarded to the State's Consulting Ophthalmologist for review. This process generally takes 2-3 weeks. If the person is deemed to be legally blind, a Property Tax Exemption Letter to the resident who is responsible to present to the municipality for consideration of a property tax exemption.
