Idea Title: Greenway Corridor Along Beaver Brook

Idea Title: A Multi-use Trail along the Beaver Brook Corridor

Idea Detail: A greenway corridor along Beaver Brook, like a riverwalk, that would be expected to flood each year. A great compromise between the natural tendencies of this waterway and the need for additional public recreation opportunities that connect destinations.

Idea Title: Community green house/ garden / year round farmers market

Idea Detail: To build a more sustainable community with a community green house and garden. People can rent plots of land to plant their own garden. Surplus will go to the community kitchen, the homeless community will have a plot donated to them to grow and harvest their own food. Classes can be taught on how to grow your own food, inside the green house there can be a small kitchen area where cooking classes can be put on showing the community how to cook with their harvest.

Another building can be devoted to a creative work space. Open concept with studio space for artists, long desk-like tables for the business folks in need of a place to work (freelancers in search of a more office setting without having to rent their own building).

Any new building erected should be build with specifications to house green rooftops which will help with sewer pollution, area flooding, etc. Water runoff can be diverted to the community garden space.

My vision is a fully sustainable, integrated area.

Idea Title: Business Incubator Options

Idea Detail: Perhaps some of the vacant buildings closer to Hannah Grimes could serve as "Business Incubators" . Hannah Grimes is in the business of helping small businesses create a firm foundation, if the Former YMCA or Middle School could be adapted to facilitate that effort, it might make for a unique small business draw for the area.

Idea Title: Turn Kingsbury into green space

Idea Detail: This is not my idea, but it would behoove the tax payers of Keene to purchase this property, raze the building to help mitigate the Beaver brook flooding, extend Victoria street to Marlboro st to help alleviate downtown traffic, create an entrance/exit from the bike path (any body who has used this path understands), and encourage industrial use away from downtown. Look, I'm the first one to complain about City spending, but this just makes sense.

Idea Title: Community garden, greenhouse and farmers market

Idea Detail: A community garden and greenhouse would greatly benefit the community and make it more sustainable. Renting out plots of land to community members will allow them to grow their own food. A plot will be donated to the homeless, where they will be able to grow and harvest their own food, surplus will be

donated to the community kitchen. In the greenhouse can be a small kitchen for demonstrations on how to cook with your fresh harvest. Classes can be taught on growing food, biodiversity, etc... There can be a designated children's plot where area daycare businesses can bring children to learn and participate in gardening. All newly erected buildings will be built to specifications allowing green rooftops which will prevent water run off pollution, flooding, and water can be collected for the community garden area. A building or space can be devoted to a year round Farmer's Market. Another space can be for a shared office, where those in need of an office space can gather to work.

Idea Title: Uses can be varied

Idea Detail: Trails to the falls at the upper end, a continued green space along Beaver Brook, with exercise stations, resting benches and picnic tables. There can be housing if at elevations so homes will not be flooded. Low income and homeless shelters again at elevations so they will not be flooded. Water retention areas to disperse water back up from spring ice out should be included. Use of lower areas where flooding is more likely to occur should have restricted use, building should not be permitted.

Idea Title: A Unique Architectural Theme (visual draw)

Idea Detail: The "Corridor" concept keeps popping up in conversations and it sparked the thought to somehow tie all the ideas into a visual / architectural theme that could run through that corridor. Some ideas include:

- A theme that links the green space parks scattered along a Beaver Brook walkway, perhaps unique landscaping or solar powered street lighting.
- Somehow integrating the historic industrial nature of the area into transitional themed rchitecture. Railroads to greenspace / mixed use etc.
- Building codes that support a theme for the "Corridor".
- Unique street signage / path signage that follows the corridor path and tends to draw traffic along it.
- Walkways lead to green space, lead to small outdoor music venues, lead to business / restaurants etc.

The general idea is to create a visual feel of a "Corridor" that creates a natural flow of people and traffic. West Keene seems to have the major shopping malls; East Keene needs something to tie it in with Downtown.

Idea Title: Make this neighborhood the jewel of Keene

Idea Detail: Attract young families and retirees looking for parks and greenways, bike paths, green housing options, community gardens and proximity to downtown

Some of the older buildings could be repurposed to house those with out homes. Upper floors arraigned with small bedrooms would avoid most of the flood damage. Other bigger rooms could be fashioned to house homeless families.

Idea Title: Renovate the middle school

Idea Detail: Make it a combination Community Kitchen/Shelter. There is a great kitchen. The building is large enough that part can be a mens shelter, part a womens and part a family shelter. The yard is fenced in so any children have a safe place to play. It's a great idea and maybe the contractors in Keene and surrounding towns will volunteer some time to work on it. Just a thought. It is getting ridiculous to see all the empty buildings just sitting. Time to start using them. Maybe the YMCA can be used along with the middle school. The people staying there can compensate by doing cleaning, light maintenance, etc. Some of these homeless are just jobless so it will also give them some purpose in their daily life.

Idea Title: Privately owned property works to best use by economic force

Idea Detail: When a business fails leaving behind a empty bldg. the value of that property is determined by the market for it.
