City of Keene, Trustee of Trust Funds Investment Policy as of October 21, 2020

Trustees of Trust Funds shall review and confirm the objectives and constraints of the investment policy at least annually, keeping in mind the safety, liquidity and yield of the trust funds, and shall file a copy of the same with the attorney general in accordance with RSA 31:25.

Investment Objectives:

The specific investment objectives for the Trust Fund's assets are:

- The Trust Fund has a primary objective of maximizing income and preserving the principal by exceeding the CPI by 1%. The goal of the Fund's equity component is to exceed the S&P 500 total return over a full market cycle.
- Asset mix for the Trust Fund is targeted to achieve the above objectives. Equities can range from 35%-75% while bonds can range from 25%-65% and cash 0%-10%.
- The Trust Fund has a long term investment horizon.

Constraints:

- Investments shall comply with the Prudent Investor Rule. (RSA 31:25-d)
- The Investment Advisor shall maintain sole investment authority of the portfolio subject to quarterly review by the Trustee of Trust Funds. Upon review the Trustees have the authority to request changes within the portfolio. Emphasis on the selection of equities should be on stocks of high-grade companies having inflation hedge characteristics i.e. companies whose growth in earnings and/or dividends should keep pace with or exceed the rate of inflation. Emphasis should be placed on seasoned companies with proven track records, favorable prospects and sound financial positions.
- The portfolio shall be diversified by asset allocation, market capitalization rate, style, sector and geography.
- Investments in international securities up to 30% of the stock position and as much as 10% of the bond position shall be permitted.
- Investments in cash and cash equivalents shall be limited to insured or collateralized bank deposits, US Treasury Bills, repurchase agreements, or money market funds whose investments are limited to short term direct obligations of the US Treasury, US Government Agencies or domestic corporations. In no event shall cash deposits be held in any institution located outside the United States.
- Fixed income securities shall have a weighted average maturity of not more than ten (10) years, and a single issue maturity of thirty (30) years.
- The overall fixed income portfolio shall maintain a minimum credit quality rating of A. Lower quality bonds (below BBB rated) shall be limited to 10% of the fixed income portfolio.
- No single equity shall comprise more than 5% of the total value of the total portfolio.
- The portfolio shall be diversified by sector with no equity investment in any one industrial group exceeding more than twice the industry weighting based upon the S&P 500 industry categories.



- Fees for Investment Advisory services shall be charged 100% to Income.
- The fund shall comply with all laws, rules and regulations of the State of New Hampshire.

Performance Measurement:

- Equities will be measured against a global equity benchmark that is comprised with 80%
 S&P 500 Index Nasdaq US Broad Dividend Achievers Index
 and 20% MSCI ACWI ex US.
 S&P Global Ex-US Dividend Growers Index
- Fixed income will be measured against the Bloomberg Barclays Intermediate Government/Credit Index.

Reviews:

- The Trustees of Trust Funds will meet monthly to review the accounts and act on requested disbursements.
- Every five years the Trustees will evaluate the performance of the investment advisor and may request RFP's from approved State of NH financial institutions. If mutually agreed, the investment advisor contract may be renewed for two (2), one-year periods for a possible total of seven years.

City of Keene, Trustee of Trust Funds Capital Reserve Investment Policy as of October 21, 2020

Trustees will review the objectives and constraints at least annually.

Investment Objectives:

The specific investment objectives for the Capital Reserve Fund's assets are:

- Safety- the safety of principal is the foremost objective
- Liquidity- investments shall remain sufficiently liquid to meet the operational cash needs of the City of Keene
- Yield- taking into account the priority objectives of safety of principal and liquidity, a market rate of return and administrative efficiency

Authorized Investments:

The Trustees use the professional services provided by an Investment Advisor to best take advantage of secondary markets not available to the Trustees. They include but are not limited to T-Bills, T-Notes, other U.S. Government obligations and Certificates of Deposit.

Constraints:

- Capital and other reserve funds appropriated pursuant to the provisions of Chapters 34, 35 RSA shall be invested to maintain principal and provide liquidity, due to the expendable nature and short term horizon of the funds. The Trustees are aware that meeting these objectives may restrict the level of yield attainable.
- Capital reserve funds shall be kept in a separate account or sub-account and shall be invested only in:
 - 1. Deposits in any federally or state chartered bank or association authorized to engage in a banking business in the United States;
 - 2. Participation units in the public deposit investment pool established pursuant to RSA 383:22; and
 - 3. Obligations with principal and interest fully guaranteed by the United States government or a federal agency of the United States government.
- The Investment Advisor shall provide the Trustees with monthly statements and periodic reports. A minimum of two (2) semi-annual reports will be in-person or by remote participation (e.g. ZOOM). Additional periodic reports, as deemed necessary by the Trustees, may be inperson, via conference call, remote participation or written only at the discretion of the Trustees.
- The investment policy is reviewed annually at a posted meeting of the Trustees with recommendations from the Investment Advisor.

Performance Measurement:

• Performance will be measured against the Bloomberg Barclays 1-3 year US Government Index.

Trustees will review the objectives and constraints at least annually.

Investment Objectives:

The specific investment objectives for the Library Renovation Trust Fund's assets are:

- Safety- the safety of principal is the foremost objective
- Liquidity- investments shall remain sufficiently liquid to meet the operational cash needs of the City of Keene related to the Library Renovation Project.
- Yield- taking into account the priority objectives of safety of principal and liquidity, a market rate of return and administrative efficiency

Authorized Investments:

Effective May 2020, due to the minimal amount of funds remaining in Library Renovation Trust Fund, the funds are maintained in an escrow money market account with the City of Keene.

Constraints:

- Library Renovation Trust Fund shall be invested to maintain principal and provide liquidity, due to the expendable nature and short term horizon of the funds. The Trustees are aware that meeting these objectives may restrict the level of yield attainable.
- Library Renovation Trust Fund shall be kept in a separate account or sub-account and shall be invested only in:
 - 1. Deposits in any federally or state chartered bank or association authorized to engage in a banking business in the United States;
 - 2. Participation units in the public deposit investment pool established pursuant to RSA 383:22; and
 - 3. Obligations with principal and interest fully guaranteed by the United States government or a federal agency of the United States government.
- The investment policy is reviewed annually at a posted meeting of the Trustees of Trust Funds.

Review Board, to continue to relieve active members of the KPD, injured in the line of duty, in accordance with the guidelines contained in Exhibit D and the original terms of said Trust. Said Ten Thousand Dollars (\$10,000.00) which is set aside to be maintained with future income earned on the principal balance.

B. To allow that the Trustees be authorized to expend a portion of the income balance not to exceed One Hundred Fifty Thousand Dollars (\$150,000.00), of the Trust to build and equip a gymnasium for use by active members of the KPD.

To allow that the Trustees be authorized to expend One Thousand Dollars (\$1,000.00) per year of future income from the Trust, and if not expended in any given year to accumulate said amount for future expenditure, for maintenance of the gymnasium equipment. Said maintenance expenditure may continue in perpetuity or until the gymnasium no longer exists, as long as the City of Keene matches said amount with an equal annual contribution to a non-lapsing special revenue fund to be used for the same purposes.

To allow that the Trustees be authorized to expend any remaining future income earned by the Trust, upon application to and recommendation of the Benevolent Trust Relief Review Board, to provide scholarships and tuition reimbursement to active members of the KPD, in addition to any tuition reimbursement that is currently made available to said members, and their dependant children.

Donations – Downtown Memorial Tree Fund in Memory of James P. Finnegan

Recommendation:

The City Manager do all things necessary to accept and executive, with gratitude, donations of \$100 from Ann Siegle-Drege & Marsh Drege and \$250 from Tim Finnegan made in memorial of James P. Finnegan to the Keene Downtown Memorial Tree Fund.

Background:

The Keene Downtown Memorial Tree Fund was created during the 1988 reconstruction of the downtown. The purpose of the fund was for the purchase, maintenance, and replacement of certain shade trees located in the downtown.

Mr. James P. Finnegan passed away on April 25, 2020. Mr. Finnegan was a long time resident of the area and very active in the community. LIBRARY RENOVATION TRUST FUND

- I. <u>Creation and Administration.</u> There is hereby created a City temporarily restricted trust fund to be held and administered by the Trustees of Trust Funds and Cemetery Trustees (the "Trustees") to be known as the Library Renovation Trust Fund (the "Fund"). The City of Keene on behalf of the Fund shall accept all irrevocable bequests, contributions, cash, and other gifts, payable on demand in United States currency or marketable securities to the Fund. All funds so received shall be used as set forth herein by the Trustees, or as nearly so as they can determine to be practicable in order to carry out the intent of the Fund as described herein.
- Application of Principal and Interest. The principal of the Fund, and any accrued II. interest or income thereon, shall be applied toward the costs and expenses for the renovation and expansion of the Keene Public Library located at 60 Winter Street, and including but not limited to, the renovation of the Library Annex located at 76 Winter Street, which is to be attached to and included in the Keene Public Library and surrounding library campus and as generally described on the attached diagram (collectively "Library Project"); provided, however, that if the Fund, together with any other funds that may be raised for the Library Project outside of the Fund, are insufficient to complete the Library Project as intended, then the Fund may be expended as stated in Article III, below. The Trustees shall invest all funds received by the Fund as they are authorized to do by law, until expenditures from the Fund are requested by the City of Keene for the public purposes stated herein; provided; however, that the authority for any expenditures from the fund shall rest solely with the Trustees, which authority may include expenditures from time to time, or a lump sum distribution of the Fund depending on the needs of the Library Project.
- III. Excess Principal. In the event that there is principal and accumulated interest or income in the Fund in excess of the amount necessary for the Library Project, or in the event that the Library Project cannot be completed as originally intended for any reason as determined by the City, then the Trustees shall transfer the Fund, together with accumulated interest or income, to the Library Trustees.
- IV. <u>Cessation of the Fund.</u> The Fund shall cease to exist at any time after the completion of the Library Project as described herein and as determined by the City Building Inspector, or at such time that the principal and accumulated interest or income of the Fund equals zero, but in no event later than December 31, 2025.
